# April 2015

Most of our parish churches have annual meetings in April. Everyone's very welcome to attend and details are displayed in each church. Parish churches are effectively small charities, so it is quite right that their affairs are regulated and scrutinised with church wardens, PCC members, secretaries and treasurers all being chosen during the course of the meeting.

Even though annual meetings provide a chance to review and reflect upon what has happened in the past year and to start to see where God might be at work in the future, there is often a lingering thought that they are dull and life-sapping. Why then do they always seem to happen so near to Easter, the time when we celebrate the life that we have in Christ and the joy of the resurrection?

One of the striking things about St John's gospel is that for all its drama, and remember this is the gospel we hear at Christmas with its powerful opening, 'In the beginning was the Word...', is how 'mundane' the resurrection appearances are. Jesus appears to the disciples in a room, or at the end of a fishing trip or takes Peter for a walk. And St John is not alone. In St Luke; Jesus appears on the dusty Emmaus road. It would seem that we are more likely to meet Christ in the ordinary than the extraordinary: one of the prayers we often use in church asks God to help us look for the signs of the coming of his kingdom - it is quite possible that we could see those signs in something as routine as an annual meeting!
