What's the difference between a maze and a labyrinth? You might be wondering if this is a belated Christmas cracker joke because both of them are dizzying, disorientating and ultimately confusing! But, this isn't a joke; there is a difference.

Most obviously, a maze has hedges to stop you getting a clear view of where you're going or coming from. A maze then becomes about smallness and limited vision, it is confusing because we can't see how everything fits together A labyrinth, on the other hand, has low walls, often little more than earth banks or chalk lines. In a labyrinth, we think we're lost precisely because we can see the centre that we are trying to reach and yet seem to be going in the wrong direction.

Crucially, you can get lost in a maze, but if you are willing to trust and simply follow the path you can't get lost in a labyrinth. Keep putting one foot in front of the other and trust the way and you get to the centre.

Now, what has a labyrinth got to do with Easter? I think a lot more than we might expect. Repeatedly, Jesus reassured the disciples to trust, to believe and everything would be OK. This question of trust is throughout the Easter story, from Thomas's questioning at the Last Supper, to the women wondering how to get into the tomb on Easter morning and onto the encounter full of questions on the road to Emmaus before back to Thomas again in the upper room. Through it all, the message is to trust and follow Christ the Way; may God give to us the grace to do that this Easter.
