'I find that as I get older, I believe more and more in less and less, more and more'. A longserving parish priest, previously a missionary in a remote area of Latin America, told me this and his words came back as I was talking with someone about how our faith grows and changes.

What the priest meant was that as time has gone by, his faith had been distilled down into a very small piece. This was the less and less, in the middle; things that had seemed so passionately important when he was younger had gradually fallen by the wayside and become distractions. However, the result of this distillation, was that the parts that he was left with, were so intensely important (2nd more and more) that he couldn't trade or negotiate on these points.

Not that he was the first person to have gone through such a development. There is a tale that when St John was an old man, the local Christians having grown tired of him saying how God was love and to love one another, kept pestering him for something new. Eventually, in his exasperation with this, he announced that he would give them a new commandment; they held their breath and waited, until he finally declared, 'A new commandment I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so also you must love one another.'

This we will recognise from Jesus on Maundy Thursday and the message of Easter. More and more, I can confidently tell you less and less about Easter, but more and more I'm sure it's how God proclaims his total love for all creation - Happy Easter!
