Bishop Martin has said that in the current situation we have to change from being a worshipping church to being a praying church. Of course, these are not separate boxes with no overlap; we say the Lord's Prayer in every service, so we pray as we worship. And on a traditional format that prayer follows the order of Adoration, Confession, Thanksgiving, Supplication (ACTS), then prayer starts with worship.

But we are used to gathering together to worship, and that can no longer happen. Though as you'll see (inside) we've lots of ways that the rhythm of worship is continuing and being relayed by facebook, or joining in on Skype.

It is increasingly difficult to do anything, especially with the growing restrictions on movement and the need for people to be self-isolated and be protected from infection. So, more and more, we can't be a worshipping or an engaged church, which leaves us to be a praying church.

The Orthodox church is known for the splendour of its worship, but behind the scenes its monasteries have long been its place of prayer; one Greek monk described them as the church's radio operators. Perhaps that's what a praying church is, the radio operators transmitting the supplications of the world to God and in turn passing on God's message of love, grace and mercy.

What would it look like? Well, radio operators are usually hidden away, out of the front line and kept safe from harm, ideally in a quiet spot without interruptions or distractions. That sounds like the place many of us find ourselves in at the moment. Maybe now is our chance to join that monk as a radio operator. As a praying church, let us be faithful and diligent in that task. **Rev'd Michael Womack**
