Revd Eleanor's birthday is the last day of the tax year. Her mother used to joke that she scheduled the birth for that day for reasons of financial planning.

The anniversary of the first lockdown has passed, and I think that it is fair to say that many of us have experienced the passage of time differently under these difficult circumstances. The term Groundhog Day has been used a lot, in reference to the 1993 film where Bill Murray's character gets stuck in a time loop and the same day is lived repeatedly. It is true that the rhythm of life since March 2020 has been different, but the cycle of the year has still taken place in the usual way. And we've all had a birthday during this period, we're all a year older.

The Bible readings set out in the lectionary have recently included lots of passages from John's Gospel. One of the things that the Gospel writer has taken care over is to specify the time of year when many of the events take place. This is done by referencing the religious festivals with which they coincided. Thus over the cycle of the religious year is mapped the unfolding of Jesus' ministry. As an annual cycle turns, the path to salvation advances.

The plot of Groundhog Day is about the passage of the seasons from winter to spring, and the growth of the lead character into a better person.

As we approach the great celebration of Easter, it will be another festival held under COVID restrictions, but it will still be Easter. We are redeemed. **Revd John McCracken**
