I've recently discovered that 'the Lord loves a cheerful giver" *really is* in the Bible! I'd always thought it was a Victorian faux proverb rather like 'cleanliness is next to godliness'. St Paul quotes it when he is writing to the church in Corinth; the complication is that he is using the Latin translation of the Old Testament that he had and which we no longer use.

To stay in a suitably pauline style, the point is this - St Paul uses the quote when talking to the church in Corinth about a collection for relief of the poor which they are being slow to complete. However, he uses it more broadly than the stereotyped version of the parson collecting funds with a cynical smile to reflect on how we should give with a generous heart more broadly.

It is obvious that there any number of shortages in our churches; money but also church wardens and other officers, PCC members and deanery synod representatives. All of them need doing; staying with St Paul it is like the dream he had of the man from Macedonia asking him to come over and help us! But, we must always think first and foremost of our motivation; why are we doing this? Are we doing these jobs as chores; grudgingly because 'there's nobody else to do them' or as part of our worship, our offering of loving service to God through others?

Preparing to help lead the summer school for trainee priests, I refreshed the '7 marks of a healthy church'. Topping that list is, 'energised by faith'. If we're not energised by faith, isn't it better to stop and take stock rather than give grudgingly? **Rev Michael**

Safeguarding courses

It is the small army of people who bring a church to life. Many people visit our churches during the week, maybe to admire the building, but often find a place of quiet and peace.

Some people that visit are dealing with all kinds of fears, anxieties and pain. Because of the nature of the church, it often feels, a safe place to come, and if you are there arranging flowers, cleaning, getting ready to serve coffee or preparing for a service, the visitor will often speak to you and maybe even disclose some kind of neglect or abuse they have suffered in the past or are continuing to suffer. If that happens, we want everyone to know how to respond.

There is a new training course, C0, that is designed to do just that. From this month, Mary Lewis (who has been trained by the diocese, alongside her own experience as a chair of school governors) will start running the courses in our benefice, where we will give you tea and cake, be able to thank you in person for all you do, and we can do the course together. I am aware that for many of us, time is precious, and some of the things that you will be made aware of can be upsetting but, we cannot ignore what goes on. Sadly, even in our lovely villages there will be people who are suffering some kind of abuse or neglect. Please try to come along to a session.
