# August 2021 News

## Freedom and responsibility

The Church of England has issued guidance on the approach to church services now that all legal Covid 19 restrictions have been lifted. We have freedom to go back to 'normal', but we also have a responsibility to look after those who are cautious about doing so. These are the arrangements we propose to adopt in the Hoxne benefice.

For our normal Sunday services:

- masks are optional;

- people can decide where to sit, but we do ask everybody to be sensitive to anyone who prefers to maintain a social distance for the time being;

- we will sing hymns where people are comfortable with it;

- we will continue to exchange the Peace without physical contact (except for members of the same household);

- we are now allowed to offer the wine as well as the bread at Holy Communion. The clergy have agreed however that it is too soon for us all to be drinking from the same chalice.

Accordingly we will offer what is called "simultaneous administration" where the priest will briefly dip each wafer in the wine before placing it in each communicant's hand. The priest will not drink from the cup until everyone else has communicated.

We will designate one or two services each month as "extra-secure" and retain all the former precautions, for a trial period anyway, to allow those who are nervous about the removal of restrictions to worship in an environment which feels safe to them. This month the BCP Communion service at Hoxne on Sunday 1<sup>st</sup> August will be "extra-secure".

For larger services, such as the Lammas service on Wednesday 4<sup>th</sup> August at Hoxne, we will make individual plans.

We will keep this approach under review. Any comments you have will be very welcome. We want everyone to be comfortable worshipping in church while taking advantage where we can of our new freedoms.
