The key human aspect of the Nativity story is how a pregnant, migrant woman is given shelter where she can give birth. It is a very powerful image that features on many Christmas cards.

Hospitality and welcome are central to Benedictine monasteries and I am equally concerned that churches are also places of welcome and hospitality. This came home to me very forcibly on our trip to Norway where time after time we tried to get into a church only to find it locked. This seemed particularly ironic in the case of the railway carriage that had been converted to a church that even had a notice on the locked door saying that everyone was welcome to come in. Actions speak louder than words! It is easy enough to print a notice saying 'welcome', it doesn't take a great deal to say 'welcome'; but there is an adage that you should listen with your eyes - what welcome is seen by a locked church? What welcome is received from a cold heart?

A lot of Christmas is trimming and frills. All the wrapping paper, cards and decorations will be gone twelve days later (sooner if the shops have their way). Beneath all the trimming and frills though, what will really last? What message of Christmas will visitors to our churches, to our homes see this Christmas? Will it be a Christian one of welcome, reconciliation and hope? Or will it be a 'commercial' one of you can come in as long as you pay your part?

The landlord welcomed Mary and Joseph at Christmas. God welcomes us every second of our lives. May we be people of God who are just as welcoming. **Reverend Michael**
