Spring growth

As I write this, it is clear that in spite of the welcome vaccination programme going ahead now in Suffolk, the threat of the coronavirus is going to be with us for some time to come. People are still getting sick and sadly some are still dying and all of us are suffering to a greater or lesser extent from the restrictions we continue to have to live under.

What does Christianity have to offer in the face of this situation? I can put it quite briefly: the good news that God is with us and has redeemed us through Jesus Christ.
