Often, we then feel guilty and despondent. I think one of the features of modern life is the burden of unatoned guilt, be it parents about what Brexit will do for their children, or everyone about the environment!

Fortunately, Christianity has always been realistic about the human condition, and our worship includes a period of reflection and general confession for the things we've done wrong. And it is then followed by the assurance, the remembering of God's forgiveness. This is part of our worship because it is what we hope for. Not in the way that we hope for a white Christmas, or a particular present but in the way that our hope is based on a faith, a confidence in God.

It is good to remember that, as the Christmas decorations are tidied away for another year, that to paraphrase the Dog's Trust slogan, 'Christ isn't just for Christmas!' Rather, God, being equally knowledgeable of the human condition, came as the baby to save us from our sins, to save us from ourselves and to free us from guilt.

But I don't want to discourage new year resolutions, so why not join us at the new Café Church in Hoxne when we'll be thinking about them as well? Sunday 12 Jan, 9.30 for 10am.

Historically, the church knows this - the lectionary after Christmas contains St. Stephen the first martyr; St John, to whom, in the words of Amy Carmichael, was entrusted the slow martyrdom of exiled longevity, and Thomas Beckett - killed in Canterbury Cathedral - a weighty counterpoint to the joy of Christmas. The modern church realises the pastoral need of many for whom it is a Blue Christmas and offers a service that is calmer and more reflective. This year, our benefice Holy Communion will be our Blue Christmas, with some gentler carols to sing, a lovely hymn from the Benefice Blasters during Communion, and the whole service will have a soft tone for it.
