From the rector.....

Petertide at the end of June will be particularly joyous in our benefice; many of us are going to the cathedral on Saturday morning to be part of John McCracken's ordination. Then on Sunday, it will be the patronal festival for St Peter's, Athelington, when we will have our benefice service with a reception at the Old Rectory afterwards, courtesy of Nick and Matt. None of our parish churches, least of all Athelington, is ever going to be mistaken for a cathedral, but I think that at heart these two events have something in common.

From July, Rev John will be embarking upon the next stage of his ministry among us. In some respects it feels like a loss because John will be less visibly active in the benefice because he has to attend lots of training events, and will be required to shadow me.

Anyone who was at John's 'sending' evensong Sunday 23 June, will sense that this is heading towards the paradox I mentioned, of how God is present in both the splendour and precision of the cathedral AND the intimacy and spontaneity of a pre-lunch drink in the Suffolk countryside.

It is this diversity that means we can all encounter God. But there's a catch! It is that same diversity that means we can all minister, which I think is really church-speak for bringing the love of God to others; yes John is now an ordained minister, but we are all ministers and we should all remember St Paul's advice, 'whatever you do, do it as if you were doing it specifically for God'. **Rev Michael.**
