At the Archdeacon's visitation in Wingfield, Archdeacon Ian was speaking about the importance of parish churches being places of welcome for the whole community. As is well known, I'm always relieved when the diocese catches up! As I wrote last month, Rev Eleanor and I are already booked on a retreat for a couple of nights in the middle of this month to think and pray about the service pattern in the benefice; in particular how our churches serve the whole community and provide a 'stepping stone', for moving on from Messy Church.

But, Rev Eleanor and I can't do it alone! **We really need your insights and observations.** So far there has been a suggestion for more 'educational' rather than 'religious' services, this was discussed and rejected by the PCC. My observation is that there is a wide range of 'educational' opportunity provided in this benefice; from seasonal Lent material to a house group and movie nights as well as a previous attempt to offer a library of religious material, I think a 'reasonable faith' is to be encouraged and the opportunities are available and if more use was made of them than they could be increased.

Another PCC is going to review its BCP service. I remain committed to offering as broad a range of worship as we can, including BCP. The BCP sung evensong in Wingfield has now been running for over a year; this month we welcome the Rev Julian Barker who will reprise a sermon on the prayer of general thanksgiving which formed the basis of an article in the PBS Journal, so much for being a sleepy backwoods benefice, but if you've a thought on what else might happen, speak now! **Rev Michael**
