From the rector.....

My training incumbent, Graham Owen, was an extraordinarily generous person in many ways; and in turn shocked myself at having managed to shock him! Graham was always open to any suggestion that we could have a reception, or better still 'a bit of a do', to mark events in the life of the church. This was something that was already in me and so it was, that one day I remarked that if I wasn't a Christian, I'd be a Sikh; to which Graham looked shocked and the conversation took a change of direction.

Seven or eight years later, and I still hold that if I wasn't a Christian, I'd be a Sikh. The aspect of Sikhism that particularly attracts me is the Langer. The communal kitchen in which all guests are served a free meal regardless of class, wealth or any other social condition. I'm sure you can already see a link into Christianity, for example in monastic communities who also place an emphasis on hospitality. Or in the injunction in Hebrews to practice hospitality because in doing so some have entertained angels without knowing it; itself a reference to the tale of Abraham and Sarah.

In the gospels, the foundational story is the last supper, which we repeat - as opposed to foot washing (to my great relief). Humorously every chapter in Mark's gospel has a reference to food in it. Remembering all that I learnt from Graham, I rejoice that he now enjoys the very banquet of heaven, let's anticipate it here on earth by practising hospitality. **Rev Michael.**
