My impression is that it has been an extremely good year for snowdrops. They seem to have laid an extremely thick carpet in Syleham churchyard and along the Waveney valley and brought a splash of brightness to the churchyard in Hoxne. Judging by the popularity of snowdrop walks, I'm not the only person who enjoys them. They are a cheerful little flower that brings hope and optimism for better times during the darker days of winter. Jesus told us to consider the lilies of the valley, but what can we learn from considering snowdrops?

What I like about snowdrops is that they lighten the dark days of winter and reassure us that things will get better and the corner will be turned. In St Mark's gospel, Jesus comes and proclaims that the kingdom of God is at hand, just when the despotic King Herod has thrown John the Baptist in prison. Like the snowdrops, Jesus says things are about to get better.

Another thought, again linked to John the Baptist; on seeing Jesus, (this time in St John's gospel) he declares that Jesus must increase and he must decrease. Snowdrops are very good at giving way to the daffodils; of playing their part and then being humble enough to let another have their turn. In the Bible this is 'forbearing one another', a good Christian virtue. Jesus was right (no surprise there); we do well to consider the lilies of the valley or even the snowdrops of the Waveney.
