'Father, if you are willing, remove this cup from me; yet, not my will but yours be done.' Late on the night of Maundy Thursday this was part of Jesus' prayer before his arrest. Jesus surrenders himself to the will of his heavenly father. He accepts the destiny that has been bestowed upon him. Earlier in St Luke's gospel, we read of how Jesus set his face to go to Jerusalem; some versions talk of him being as set firm as flint on this matter. Again, there is the image that he accepts what lies in store for him.

In our first Lent lunch we 'chewed over', destiny, fate, providence; a concept so difficult that we hide it in amongst lots of different words! In particular, I highlighted how the book of Esther was particularly controversial because God is never mentioned but through it all is the idea of God 'working his purposes out'.

How to handle fate is a thorny problem; we often have a grudging admiration of those who are able to calmly, peacefully accept it with great dignity. And yet as Protestants, we are, historically, the most vigorous protesters against the wrongs of the world and not willing to accept things.

As Lent continues through March, my prayer for us all is that we'll be able to take inspiration from the resolve of Jesus to fulfil his destiny, of the great paradox with which he accepted his death to protest, challenge and ultimately change the power of death, that we'll be able to take to heart the prayer of Reinhold Niebuhr, 'God grant me the serenity to accept the things I cannot change, the courage to change the things I can, and the wisdom to know the difference.' **Reverend Michael**
