This year Ascension Day is Thursday 25 May, Ascension Day is a 'difficult' festival. Like the original disciples, we are tempted to stare into the sky and wonder what happened! Perhaps this is why it has slipped the furthest in status in living memory; it has gone from a day off school to all but ignored.

Personally, I shall be taking to the air on Ascension Day; not in rapt ascension to heaven but by the more mundane method of a plane. We're going to Rome to visit the catacombs and excavations underneath St Peter's Basilica. With my fascination of paradox and spiritual truth, it seems appropriate that I will be ascending so that I can descend. Or, staying with St Peter but turning to his letters in the Bible, how Christ descends into hell before ascending into heaven.

Christianity is often described as the upside down religion; Christ humbled himself to be exalted (*kenosis* for the Greek lovers) or how Jesus himself said that to find life we have to be willing to die. Put into the context of this upside down faith, it doesn't seem so odd to go up to go down. And there's another paradox to consider; Ascension Day is also about the future; of how the angels, after asking the disciples why they are staring into the sky, add 'this Lord Jesus will come again'. Yet, Christianity is a very historical, 'looking backwards' faith. Within this paradox, going to look at old Christian sites on a day for looking forward makes a lot more sense. May this Ascensiontide be a season when we better see the paradoxes within our faith. **Rev Michael**
