November, and the changing leaves prompt us that change comes naturally. Sometimes that change creeps upon us as gently and subtly as the lengthening nights; at other times it catches us off-guard with its abruptness as when a sharp frost sends a shiver down our spines.

Caught off-guard myself, I might in some small measure be over-coming my allergy to cathedrals, though the circumstances must be exactly right! Mary and I went to the cathedral in Alta, Norway. Like all cathedrals there is an admission charge, but being Lutherans the dedication is different and this is the Cathedral of the Northern Lights. In this setting, things that have always seemed strange such as Ezekiel speaking of lights in the sky started to make some sense. As did the Jacob's Ladder chapel and its position directly inside the main door. A prayer space positioned there shouldn't work, but like God, it defies human logic and immediately moves thoughts heavenward, away from the daily rush and into the Peace of God.

The cathedral only seats about 250 but is spacious and filled with light of a very special quality. Nearly all of it is diffused from concealed light rods, the few windows are on the north side. In this place of prayer there are no bright shafts of light bringing divine revelation. Instead there are clues and hints- icons and symbols distilled to a few lines and lit by gentle light.

My prayer for all of us this November is that in its subtle light we will catch a fresh glimpse of God in the images around Remembrance, St. Edmund and the lives of our 'private saints' through the Service of Memorial and Thanksgiving and the All Saints' Festival. **Rev Michael**
