From the rector

A European might say that they dreamt a deceased relative spoke to them; an African is more likely to say that a deceased relative spoke to them in a dream; what's the difference?! I can't explain that in 280 words, but November is definitely the month when we westerners allow ourselves the chance to admit that there might be something in the African phrase.

In November, we are conscious that those who have gone before us are actually still very close. Perhaps we're more comfortable with the Celtic thought that this is a 'thin time' of the year when the barrier between living and departed is silken thin, delicate as an autumn leaf.

The church calendar reflects this with the commemorations of All Saints, followed by All Souls (see inside for Memorial and Thanksgiving in Hoxne), then Remembrance Sunday.

It's also said that you can never capture the soul of Africa but Africa always captures your soul and so I'm very glad that in marked contrast to the autumnal weather, it's quite an African month in our benefice. We'll be focussed on our partner diocese of Kagera in NW Tanzania firstly at Messy Church; in the morning services I'll bring an African perspective to the Bible passages and then on the last Sunday of the month, the Kagera team from the diocese will be leading our benefice evensong in Wingfield.

One final observation, if New York is a little bit of Europe in America, then South Africa is a little bit of Europe in Africa, but because Africa captures your heart, we'll be there for a large part of November- being close to some of our living relatives!
