From the rector

Mary and I are off on our Falls tour; a trip to Niagara Falls combined with seeing the autumn colours of New England (well they're virtually next door). It's on our bucket list and we need to start somewhere!

Autumn is a season for thinking about endings and what will come next, as well as reflecting on what has happened in the year drawing to a close and our lives more broadly. Although the Christian faith is centred upon our story within Christ's story, and ultimately with the resurrection and continuance of life eternal, the Bible has sections which are the work of an older writer coming to the end of their days on earth.

Such as St Paul in 2 Timothy, here he writes to his protégé Timothy in the autumn, both literal and metaphorical of his life as he begs Timothy to do his best to get to him in Rome before winter (2 Tim 4:9, 21). This closing chapter (quite possibly one of the last things that Paul wrote), is a fascinating blend of practicalities, such as to bring Paul a cloak for the cold evenings - after all life still goes on. Along with reflective sections of who has hurt him (but I've always said that my memoirs will be called, Names have been Changed to Protect the *Guilty*), encouragement to Timothy in his own ministry and an acceptance of his situation, 'For I am already being poured out like a drink offering, and the time for my departure is near' (2 Tim 4:6).

In the longer evenings of autumn, it would be a worthwhile exercise to write our own version of 2 Timothy and reflect on how we can encourage others and consider our own readiness to move on. Rev Michael Womack
