I have been really touched by the welcomes and concerns expressed from my picking up Michael Womack's diary. Thank you for the support and prayer around us both! But I've also been thinking of the historic role clergy used to fulfil, expectations that still linger in some places but are no longer realistic. In many cases, clerical roles have been taken away from us by professional practitioners: social and medical care, the major responsibilities on governing bodies and charities.

Clergy have also been custodians of the Community Story, hearing it at intimate levels, sometimes in the confessional! But as secularism and non-religious ceremonies now mark so many peoples' lives, even this is being curtailed. So the question is, what do clergy realistically 'do' outside taking services and officiating at those celebrations of peoples' stories that still come our way? Perhaps the answer is not so much about what the clergy might or might not do. The first question we have to wrestle with, as Michael takes time to be healed, is to ask what we want our vicar to be! Ordination is about someone so giving themselves to God's purposes that they are prepared to go on becoming a signal, or a voice, or a reminder, or an echo, of what we believe God to be. And the most perfect example of that is none other than Jesus Christ.

So are we on the lookout for Jesus Christ, coming among us in the guise of the faithful priest? And I need not remind you that sometimes the cost of being that person is a hugely demanding one. So it then follows - and it is in this order - that we must be clear as to what we need them to 'do'; things we cannot 'do' ourselves and in which we welcome their contribution. Please use September to think about these things. May God bless you.
