This month is the 4th anniversary of my arrival in the benefice and I've been thinking about my first few sermons. In a nutshell, I said it would be best if I said 'sorry' as my opening word because I'm going to upset everybody; some will think I change things too quickly, some too slowly and the handful who think I'm changing things at the right pace will be disappointed about the things that change. I think I was right!

Recovering from my nervous breakdown, I spent a lot of time reflecting on the very nature of ministry. It seems to me there are three approaches. The managers are very good at getting things done. The really rare ones are the mentors who are able to explain what is being done and help others to do it. And finally there are the modellers; they depend on people seeing what's happening, working it out and taking things on for themselves.

Which is best? As with most things in life, it depends what the circumstances are as to which is best. And circumstances, like life is always changing. For my part, it was very heartening when someone stood up in a church service in August and said sorry.

Sorry is a very important word in the Christian faith. As St John wrote, 'If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he who is faithful and just will forgive us our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness. If we say that we have not sinned, we make him a liar, and his word is not in us.' May God's word of life dwell ever more deeply in us in the coming years.
