From the rector

September, and the nights are noticeably longer and cooler. The dark night is one of the most powerful images in our imaginations.

It's no surprise that it's an image that artists have explored. George Harrison, comes to it at least twice on the album All things must pass, once in the title track with the verse 'Now the darkness only stays at night time. In the morning it will fade away. Daylight is good at arriving at the right time but it's not always going to be this grey'. But also in Beware of Darkness (which does contain problems for a Christian - ask me if you're interested!).

Likewise, St John makes rich use of the darkness metaphor. The opening of his gospel celebrates the triumph of light over darkness with even more grandeur than Harrison with the declaration, 'The true light that gives light to everyone was coming into the world.' Jesus talks of darkness when, as he heals the man born blind in chapter 9 he says, 'I must work the works of him that sent me, while it is day: the night cometh, when no man can work.'

Or at least, that's how the King James version translates it! More recent translations make a subtle, crucial shift and prefer, 'As long as it is day, we must do the works of him who sent me. Night is coming, when no one can work.' Returning to Beware of Darkness, Harrison advises, 'It can hit you. It can hurt you. Make you sore and what is more. That is not what you are here for.'

Indeed, we are not here to be scared of the dark, because Christ has overcome the darkness, and the sun will come! Rev Michael Womack
