#### Wheat and tares together sown

September is traditionally the time for Harvest Festivals. We will indeed be celebrating Harvest in each of our churches over the next two months, even if our festivals have to be a bit different from usual (details elsewhere in this newsletter). Now is a time perhaps to reflect on the metaphorical harvest of wheat and tares we are seeing from the last year.

The tares are all too flourishing around us: sickness and death from Covid-19 and other causes; loneliness or domestic abuse as a result of lockdown; children's and young people's education interrupted; jobs and businesses under threat or already lost. Across the world we see tyrannical government, breakdown in international co-operation, environmental disaster, war and poverty, a plague of locusts in Africa, desperate refugees fleeing these situations.

But the wheat has also been growing and ripening. God is at work in the most difficult situations. We have become increasingly aware of the injustice in our society, as we have recognised that the poor and BAME groups have been disproportionately affected by the pandemic - and awareness is a necessary beginning to putting things right. We have appreciated the essential services we tend to take for granted. We have remembered our neighbours who are isolated or frail. We have had a chance to stop and enjoy the glories of nature around us. We have had more time to pray and to remember God.

As we go forward the challenges of the tares will still be with us. Can we tend the wheat and help it to grow more strongly? Will we learn the lessons of the last year and put them into practice in a new future? There are some other words in that harvest hymn worth focusing on: 'We ourselves are God's own field.

fruit unto his praise to yield, grant, O harvest Lord, that we wholesome grain and pure may be.' Stay safe. Rev'd Eleanor Goodison
