#### Your word is a lamp to my feet



November is a notoriously dark month: the clocks go back and the evenings suddenly draw in. The weather tends to be gloomy too. Carrying a torch is a good idea. Spiritually and emotionally we may feel low but Psalm 119 reassures us, saying God's word "is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path". As the clocks go back on the last Sunday of October, we celebrate Bible Sunday and the word of God which guides us all through the winter and the rest of the year as well.

November in the church's year actually starts with another celebration - the celebration of All Saints (or All Hallows), a joyful occasion for rejoicing rather than dwelling on ghosts and ghoulishness.
